The Parochial Pen

My dear parishioners,

People throughout the Scranton Diocese, and throughout the country, are still feeling the negative effects of the Covid-19 shutdowns that have disrupted our social, economic, political and religious experiences. I am sure that you are aware of the situations! At the parochial level, we in Dupont (and many others parishes) have seen a decline in the number of people attending Mass and receiving other sacraments. We have seen a decline in people wishing to return to serve as lectors, acolytes, cantors, choir members, and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. We have seen a decline in the number of people wishing to volunteer for parish activities or attend parish group meetings. People want to “stay home and stay safe” instead of resuming normal activities. This is most unfortunate, but this is the reality we pastors are indeed seeing in our parishes today. Will this trend reverse or will it continue to accelerate the pace of decline? What will this mean for our 75<sup>th</sup> annual parish picnic, our pierogi sales and other volunteer activities? Time will tell, but I want to encourage you in the words of Padre Pio to “Pray, hope and don’t worry.” If each of us intentionally chooses to live his Christian vocation in the fullest sense, then we will be free from anxiety and doubt.

Two of the recent causalities of this phenomena have been the Pastoral Outreach Apostolate and the Welcome Committee. After the Legion of Mary in our parish died off, some of their work was assumed by the Pastoral Outreach Apostolate. After the Pastoral Outreach Apostolate died off, some of their work was assumed by the Confraternity of Christian Mothers. The Welcome Committee was established as an outgrowth of the former Women’s Society to welcome new parishioners to the parish. They recently informed me that they wish to officially disband but would like to continue providing gifts for the newly baptized babies and organizing the Christmas Cookie Walk. After discussing the situation with our parish Finance Council, I have chosen to combine the financial accounts of the Pastoral Outreach Apostolate and the Welcome Committee into a new one: **the St. Vincent de Paul Society**. This group has a long history in the Catholic Church and is recognized as an international charitable organization. You can read more about them here: <https://ssvpusa.org/> The money in this new parish account will be used solely to support the charitable work of our parish. Aspects of the charitable help offered by the Legion of Mary, the Pastoral Outreach Apostolate and the Welcome Committee will be combined into the St. Vincent de Paul Society. An annual envelope will appear in your packets, around the September 27 feast day of St. Vincent de Paul, which you may use to make a direct donation to support the charitable needs of our local parishioners. Anyone wishing to make a monetary donation toward this much needed outreach apostolate is asked to place their donation in an envelope marked “St. Vincent de Paul Society” and drop it in the basket or send it to the parish office at any time throughout the year. May God provide for the wants of the poor and may the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace!

## THANKSGIVING DAY MASS

Come sing your favorite Thanksgiving hymns, and participate in this ultimate act of thanksgiving before turning to your family celebrations later in the day.

**Thursday, November 25, 9:00 a.m.**

**The Parish Office will be closed** Thursday, Nov. 25 and Friday, Nov. 26 in observance of Thanksgiving. The office will reopen Monday, Nov. 29, at 8:30 a.m.

**The Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King** on Sunday, Nov. 21. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will begin after the 8:30 a.m. Mass and continue until the beginning of the 10:30 a.m. Mass. The Feast of Christ the King is a day when we focus on Christ reigning, enthroned in heaven, King of Heaven and Earth for all time. It reminds us that Jesus is the source and center of our lives. This day also marks the end of our liturgical year. The following Sunday we begin anew with the First Sunday of Advent. Did you know that Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 to respond to growing nationalism and secularism? He recognized that these related societal ills would breed increasing hostility against the Church. This Feast reminds us that while governments and philosophies come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.
