My dear parishioners,

Every person that attended a weekend Mass at Sacred Heart of Jesus Church was counted throughout the month of October. The ushers kept a record of the participation at every weekend Mass for the purpose of identifying trends and usage. At this time I would like to share with you the results of our annual "October Count" for the purpose of pastoral planning. The simple equations that follow give an insight into how well our Masses are attended over the period of one month (five weekends). Percentages of participation based on the total amount of registered parishioners or averages of attendance at particular Masses are valid and useful tools for further research, but my intent is to simply notify you of the results. Perhaps these numbers can be analyzed in depth by our Pastoral Council at a future date. The 2021 October Mass Attendance Count Sheet reveals:

4 p.m. Sat. Masses: Oct. 2/3 – 98, Oct. 9/10 – 93, Oct. 16/17 – 102, Oct. 23/24 – 99, Oct. 30/31 - 121, total for the month at 4 p.m.: 513 people.

8:30 a.m. Sun. Masses: Oct. 2/3 – 76, Oct. 9/10 – 84, Oct. 16/17 – 93, Oct. 23/24 – 85, Oct. 30/31 - 92, total for the month at 8:30 a.m.: 430 people.

10:30 a.m. Sun. Masses: Oct 2/3 – 111, Oct. 9/10 – 116, Oct. 16/17 – 99, Oct. 23/24 – 112, Oct. 30/31 - 117, total for the month at 10:30 a.m.: 555 people.

Sacred Heart October grand total: 1,498.

***Our "Pre-Coronavirus" October 2019 grand total was 1,738. Our "Pandemic" October 2020 grand total was 784. The Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King on

Sunday, Nov. 21. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will begin after the 8:30 a.m. Mass and continue until the beginning of the 10:30 a.m. Mass. The Feast of Christ the King is a day when we focus on Christ reigning, enthroned in heaven, King of Heaven and Earth for all time. It reminds us that Jesus is the source and center of our lives. This day also marks the end of our liturgical year. The following Sunday we begin anew with the First Sunday of Advent. Did you know that Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 to respond to growing nationalism and secularism? He recognized that these related societal ills would breed increasing hostility against the Church.
