My dear parishioners,

One of the great Advent hymns is "Lo, He Comes with Clouds Descending," written by Charles Wesley, a founder of the Methodist church. This hymn looks forward to Christ's Second Coming, to which our attention is turned in the first part of Advent. We will sing all the verses of this beautiful hymn at the opening procession of this weekend's Masses. This hymn may be sung to various tunes, but the best is Helmsley, which can be belted out in a harmonic choir, or with all the stops open on the organ.

Note the words as we sing together. Its poetry is deeply theological, beautiful and moving – the hymn tune matches the words perfectly. It is solemn, majestic and stirring. This hymn and the words are accessible to anyone and singable by all. It catechizes because it is full of Christian truth. Most importantly, it fits with the liturgy of the First Sunday of Advent.

During the 4 p.m. Vigil Mass in our church on the First Sunday of Advent, Nov. 30, the Advent Wreath will be blessed and lit following the General Intercessions. The use of the Advent Wreath is a traditional practice which has found its place in the Church as well as in the home. Customarily the Advent Wreath is constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which are inserted four candles, three are violet and one is rose. The candles represent the four weeks of Advent and the number of candles lighted each week corresponds to the number of the current week of Advent. The rose candle is lighted on the Third Sunday of Advent. We encourage our parish families to place an Advent Wreath in their home and anticipate the coming of Christ's birth by praying this tradition.

The oplatki, the traditional Eastern European Christmas Eve wafers, will be blessed during the 4 pm Mass on Nov. 30. The oplatki will be available after that Mass to mark the start of Advent. The offering is \$3 per wafer envelope. Free 2025 liturgical calendars are also available. Every Catholic household should have one! Polish Christmas Music CDs and Sacred Latin Chant CDs created by our organist, Anthony George, are available for sale at \$10 each. Also, The Cat's Meow Village wooden cut-outs of our church are being sold for \$10. All these items are now available in the church narthex.

All parishioners are invited to make use of the contribution envelope in their packets for Christmas Flower donations. All money collected will defray the cost of purchasing our sanctuary decorations and flowers for the Christmas season. Please list your Christmas intentions on the reverse side of the envelope. These envelopes will be placed in the crèche for Christmas.

Beginning the first weekend of Advent, we will be using the Mass of Charity and Love music setting for the sung parts of the Mass. The Mass of St. Francis will debut for the Christmas season.

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated December 8. This year, December 8 will fall on a Sunday - specifically the Second Sunday of Advent. As a result, the celebration of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday, December 9. Bishop Bambera has granted a dispensation to the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Monday, December 9. However, everyone is strongly encouraged to attend Mass on Monday, December 9, or do some form of extra prayer, like the Rosary. Mass will be offered in our church on December 9 at 7:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. for those who wish to celebrate this special feast of Our Lady.

A St. Nicholas Party will be held by our parish Holy Name Society on Wed., Dec. 4 at 6 pm in the church hall. All HNS members are invited to attend *and are asked to make their reservation with Greg Zawacki by calling 947-8200*.

HNS Corporate Communion Mass will be celebrated on Sun., Dec. 18, at 8:30 am. All members are to dress in suits and meet in the church hall prior to the Mass. HNS members will process and recess with Father at Mass and recite the Holy Name Pledge.

The annual Christmas Cookie Walk will be held Saturday, Dec. 14, 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. in our church hall! Volunteer bakers are needed to help supply homemade baked goodies. ST. ANDREW CHRISTMAS NOVENA

While a novena is normally a nine-day prayer, the term is sometimes used for any prayer that is repeated over a series of days. The Saint Andrew Christmas Novena is often called simply the "Christmas Novena" or the "Christmas Anticipation Prayer," because it is prayed 15 times every day from the Feast of Saint Andrew the Apostle (November 30) until Christmas. The First Sunday of Advent is the Sunday closest to the Feast of Saint Andrew. The novena is not actually addressed to Saint Andrew but to God Himself, asking Him to grant our request in the honor of the birth of His Son at Christmas. You can say the prayer all 15 times, all at once; or divide up the recitation as necessary (perhaps five times at each meal). Prayed as a family, the Saint Andrew Christmas Novena is a very good way to help focus the attention of your children on the Advent season. The novena prayer:

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold. In that hour, vouchsafe, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires, through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His Blessed Mother. Amen.
