The Parochial Pen

My dear parishioners,

This week we begin a liturgical "sub-set" of the season of Advent, known as "Late Advent," which runs from December 17 to 23. The liturgies of these weekdays are intended to prepare us more directly for the Lord's birth. The readings of the Mass focus our attention on the spiritual importance of the Incarnation. A very special feature of the Late Advent season is the appearance of the "O" Antiphons at Vespers and the verses for the Gospel Acclamations at Mass. The hymn, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," based on these antiphons, is familiar to many of us and is properly sung at this time of year. They are referred to as the "O Antiphons" because the title of each one begins with the vocative particle "O." Each antiphon is a name of Christ, one of his attributes mentioned in Scripture. They are:

17 December: O Sapientia (O Wisdom), 18 December: O Adonai (O Lord), 19 December: O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse), 20 December: O Clavis David (O Key of David), 21 December: O Oriens (O Dayspring), 22 December: O Rex Gentium (O King of the Nations), 23 December: O Emmanuel (O With Us is God)

If one starts with the last title and takes the first letter of each one - Emmanuel, Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix, Adonai, Sapientia - the Latin words *ero cras* are formed, meaning, "Tomorrow, I will come." Therefore, the Lord Jesus, whose coming we have prepared for in Advent and whom we have addressed in these seven Messianic titles, now speaks to us, "Tomorrow, I will come." So, the O Antiphons not only bring intensity to our Advent preparation but bring it to a joyful conclusion. *O Virgo Virginum* (O Virgin of virgins) is used as the Antiphon on the Benedictus at Morning Prayer on December 24. If one adds this eighth antiphon on Christmas Eve, the acrostic becomes *Vero cras*, "truly, tomorrow."

I will make use of these O Antiphons at weekday and Sunday Masses for the Gospel Acclamations during Late Advent. I invite you to attend Mass each day during this Late Advent season to hear the readings proclaimed, to hear the antiphons chanted, and to receive Holy Communion. Do not allow the hectic pace of the world to rob you of the spiritual refreshment that comes with *praying* Advent. Don't rush the coming of Christmas - you may miss Him when he arrives!

Gaudete Sunday: Certain Sundays throughout the liturgical year have taken their names from the first word in Latin of the Introit, the entrance antiphon at Mass. Gaudete Sunday is one of these. Gaudete Sunday is the Third Sunday of Advent. The Introit for Gaudete Sunday, in both the Traditional Latin Mass and the Novus Ordo, is taken from Philippians 4:4,5: *"Gaudete in Domino semper"* ("Rejoice in the Lord always"). Like Lent, Advent is a penitential season, so the priest normally wears violet vestments. But on Gaudete Sunday, having passed the midpoint of Advent, the Church lightens the mood a little, and the priest may wear rose vestments. The change in color provides us with encouragement to continue our spiritual preparation – especially prayer and fasting – for Christmas. For this same reason, the third candle of the Advent wreath, first lit on Gaudete Sunday, is traditionally rose-colored.
