The Parochial Pen

My dear parishioners,

In 2025, during the eight Sundays of Ordinary Time during the winter, we hear St. Luke's record of the beginnings of Our Lord's public ministry. Throughout this liturgical year, St. Luke's Gospel invites us to listen with our ears and hearts tuned to experience the life of Jesus. Most of our first readings will come from the prophets Isaiah and Jeremiah. Each first reading highlights an aspect of the Sunday Gospel. Isaiah focuses us on the Good News of God's great love. The passages from Jeremiah remind us of how God forms and calls us, even before our birth. The reading from Nehemiah on the Third Sunday recounts God's Law and the joyful reception of it by the people.

Our psalms pick up a theme from the First Reading and lead us to the Gospel. The psalms of this season are full of joy and trust in God. By chanting the psalms in response to the cantor, we express our love of God's word and our desire to proclaim it. When we sing the psalm at Mass, we are singing God's praises! Please do your very best to sing the psalm response each Sunday.

The second readings offer us teachings from the earliest New Testament books. In this season we will hear from Hebrews and part of 1 Corinthians. St. Paul stresses that God calls us to live in communion with one another and with Him, and to love one another as ourselves. We are invited to reaffirm our faith in Christ's Resurrection and our own.

These first weeks of Ordinary Time allow us to be caught up in the excitement of the events that occurred at the start of Our Lord's public life and ministry. We follow Jesus as he announces the key aspects of His ministry. St. Luke will show us how Jesus performs his first miracle, meets his first rejection, calls His disciples, and preaches the Sermon on the Plain. This invitation to discipleship takes us into the Season of Lent. Let us be attentive to the Liturgy of the Word this season!

2025 Polish Picnic - Friday, June 27, 5 to 9 p.m. & Saturday, June 28, 5 to 9 p.m. Our annual picnic is a family-friendly ethnic food festival that corresponds with the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. All parishioners are invited to the next picnic meeting on Wednesday, February 12, at 6 p.m. in the church hall. Come to this meeting to learn more about the positive changes taking place to our picnic. This year's chairmen are Charyl Nagy, Joe Petro and Liz Tomko They are currently in search of volunteers to help work the picnic. Please let them know that they can count on you to help with the many tasks required to run a successful picnic.

The Church celebrates the solemn Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on Feb. 2. This feast recalls the day on which Jesus Christ was presented in the temple by Mary and Joseph. This feast, also commemorated as the Fourth Joyful Mystery of the Rosary, celebrates Jesus as the Light of revelation to all the nations. According to ancient tradition, candles are blessed on this day, both those used in the church and the home. In accordance with the liturgy for the day, special candles will be blessed at Mass for the faithful to take home and use. Families have customarily lit them at the table for Easter and Christmas dinner, for sacramental visits of Holy Communion and Holy Anointing, and for blessed protection in lightning storms and power outages. The candles will be blessed in a special ritual with a procession at the 4:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday, February 2. The blessed candles may be obtained after the Mass for a donation of \$4 for a box of two "Candlemas" candles.

The Church celebrates the *Feast of St. Blaise* on Feb. 3. He was bishop of Sebaste in Armenia in the fourth century. Before being martyred, he is said to have healed a boy who was choking. He is venerated today as the patron of those who suffer from diseases of the throat. Using candles blessed the day before at the Mass of the Presentation of the Lord, the faithful will be blessed through the intercession of St. Blaise. Throats will be blessed after all weekend Masses February 1/2, as well as on February 3.

The Christmas Crib remains in our church until Candlemas. It can be found near the BVM side altar. Falling exactly 40 days after Christmas, Candlemas was observed as the official end of Christmas in medieval times. In some countries it is not unusual to retain some Christmas decorations until Candlemas on Feb. 2. Pope St. John Paul II would make his last visit to the crib in St. Peter's Square after celebrating the evening Mass on Feb. 2. After this visit the Nativity scene was dismantled. Consider making a visit to our crib this year!

Our Ash Wednesday Potato Pancake & Lenten Food Sale will be held on Wed., March 5, from 11 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. in the church garage. Our Holy Name Society will make haluski, and our CCM will provide pierogi. If anyone would like to volunteer to make meatless soups, or volunteer in any way, call Charyl Nagy: 570-540-5478. First Saturday is Feb. 1. It is very important in these times to pray the Rosary, meditate for 15 minutes on the Mysteries, and make sacramental confession and Communion in reparation for sins and blasphemies against Mary's Immaculate Heart. A Eucharistic Holy Hour will be held on Saturday, Feb. 1, from 2:45 to 3:45 pm in our church. All are invited to pray in preparation for the 4 pm Mass.

ADULT ACOLYTES NEEDED: our parish is now in the process of recruiting adult men to serve as acolytes at Mass. They would be principally used to serve funeral Masses and other liturgies when youth altar servers are unavailable. We already have a few men but could use more. They would also help serve weekday Mass when needed. No prior experience is necessary, but it's a benefit if you learned to serve Mass "in the good old days!" Please contact Fr. Petro if you are interested in volunteering for this apostolate.

Once a young adult parishioner turns eighteen, it is proper that regular adult envelopes are requested for them. They will be given their own contribution number and envelopes will be mailed to them just like their parents. All adults, from age 18 and up, are requested to support their parish by donating their monthly dues, which are currently \$6.00. This is considered the bare minimum of financial support expected for "active parishioners." When requesting a sponsor card for baptism or confirmation, seeking to celebrate matrimony, or desiring burial in our parish cemetery, one must be an active parishioner, i.e., one who practices the Faith and supports their parish.
