My dear parishioners,

On Palm Sunday, we remember Our Lord's triumphant entry into Jerusalem and prepare our hearts for Holy Week, remembering his suffering, death, and resurrection. I encourage you today to utilize the following ancient prayer that dates from around A.D. 700. It was recited at the start of Palm Sunday Mass and puts in proper perspective the spiritual aim of this beautiful liturgy, at which we receive the blessed palm branches to preserve in homes throughout the year.

"O God, whom to cherish and to love is righteousness, multiply in us the gifts of your ineffable grace; and since you have given us in the death of your Son to hope for those things which we believe, grant us by his resurrection to attain the end to which we aspire. Who lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen."

A solemn blessing and procession of palms will be held prior to the 10:30 am Mass at our church on Palm Sunday, April 13. The faithful are asked to report to the school prior to 10:30 am. The palms will be blessed there, and all will process into the church for Mass. The choir will lead us in song as we process through the rectory driveway, up the ramp and into the church.

Little Bethlehem Christians is a group that represents over 300 Christian families who live in the Holy Land and make their living as wood carvers. After all Masses on the <u>weekend of April 12/13</u>, the group represented by the Alsahouri family will have for sale a collection of hand carved religious items made from olive wood. Profits will help support Christianity in the Holy land.

Homemade Chocolate Egg pick-up will be before and after all Masses the weekend of April 12/13 in the church hall.

The Second Sunday of Easter, April 27, is also known as the Solemnity of Divine Mercy. Jesus Christ has promised to grant complete forgiveness of sins and punishment on Divine Mercy Sunday as recorded in the diary of St. Maria Faustina. The spiritual conditions for this indulgence are as follows: attend Mass on Divine Mercy Sunday, sincerely repent of all our sins and place our complete trust in Jesus, go to confession preferably before that Sunday, receive Holy Communion on that Sunday, venerate the Divine Mercy image, and be merciful to others through our actions, words and prayers on their behalf. *We will celebrate a holy hour of Eucharistic Adoration on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 27 at 3 p.m. in our church.* At this time special prayers will be said and the chaplet will be prayed in common. Confessions will also be heard. Please plan to attend to receive many graces. "Jesus, I trust in you!"

Our parish will sing "Missa Simplex" setting for the Triduum and "The Heritage Mass" for the sung parts of all Masses for the Easter season. Please participate in the Mass by singing the responses.

Please make use of the Easter Flower envelope in your offertory envelope pack. Donations will help defray the cost of purchasing flowers to adorn our sanctuary for Easter.

The parish office will be closed on Holy Thursday and on Good Friday. It will open again on Monday, April 21, 8:30am-12pm.

The deanery penance service will be on April 14, 6:30pm, at St. John the Evangelist Church, Pittston. <u>There will not be the "Light</u> is on for You" 5:30pm Confessions that day in our church.

The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated in our church on Thursday, Apr. 17 at 7 pm. This Mass commemorates Jesus' institution of the Holy Eucharist, His Holy Priesthood and His Holy Command to love and serve one another. *All Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are requested to vest in their albs and participate in the Eucharistic procession. All adult and youth altar servers are also encouraged to vest and participate. Our First Holy Communion children will also participate.* Holy Communion will be administered under both kinds. 12 HNS men will have their feet washed. The Blessed Sacrament will be reposed in the church for a period of silent adoration until 10 pm when Night Prayer will be celebrated. Members of the Holy Name Society and the Confraternity of Christian Mothers will assist with adoration and pray the rosary.

The faithful who devoutly visit the Blessed Sacrament in the repository on Holy Thursday, and recite *Our Father*, *Hail Mary* and *Glory be*, five times in order to return due thanks for the institution of the Holy Eucharist, and one *Our Father*, *Hail Mary* and *Glory be* for the intentions of the Pope, are granted a plenary indulgence.

On Good Friday, our parish will take up the annual collection for the Holy Land. We ask you to be generous. Your financial contribution will support the works of the Catholic Church in the Middle East and to protect the Holy Places and Christian shrines.

Adoration of the Cross: a *plenary indulgence* is granted the Christian faithful who devoutly take part in the adoration of the cross during the solemn liturgy of Good Friday.

The blessing of Easter food will be held on <u>Holy Saturday</u>, <u>April</u> <u>19</u>, at 11:30am and 1 pm in the church hall</u>. The faithful are invited to bring the cooked food that they will eat on Easter Sunday in baskets for blessing. This Eastern European custom spiritually links the nourishment we receive from our table with the nourishment we receive from the Eucharist. ******Our Holy Name Society will distribute the pre-ordered *kołaczki* in the hall that day, 11 a.m. - 1:30 p.m.

Homemade pizzelles by Mike Silla will be sold by our Holy Name Society on <u>Saturday</u>, April 19, 11am - 1:30pm in the church hall during the blessing of Easter baskets. Pizzelles will be available in anise flavor and vanilla with sprinkles. They will be sold in containers of 8 pieces for \$5 while supplies last!

The *Rezurekcja* (Resurrection) procession will take place during the 7:30 a.m. Easter Mass according to the Polish custom by the Holy Name Society members. The Easter Sequence will be proclaimed and the Renewal of Baptismal Promises will take the place of the Creed at all the Easter Sunday Masses.

CCD News: classes will be canceled on April 20 for Easter.

All the faithful of the Diocese are invited to attend the Chrism Mass at St. Peter's Cathedral, Scranton, on <u>Tues., Apr. 15 at 4 p.m.</u> At this Mass priests from throughout the Diocese will renew their priestly promises before the Bishop, and the oils to be used for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Anointing of the Sick and Holy Orders will be blessed. Participation in the Chrism Mass is a beautiful way to pray for our diocesan priests.

Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence from meat. <u>All</u> <u>Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence from meat</u>. Fasting prescribes that only one full meal be taken. Two smaller meals may be taken to maintain strength, but these taken should not equal another full meal. Fasting obliges from the 18^{th} to the 59th birthday. Abstinence forbids the eating of meat. Abstinence obliges from the 14^{th} birthday on.

Lenten prayer intentions: Please pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life, peace in Palestine and in Ukraine, and for the persecuted Christians in Iraq and Syria.
