My dear parishioners,

With praise and thanksgiving to Almighty God, we rejoice with the entire Church for God’s gift to us in the person of Pope Leo XIV. On Thursday, May 8, the College of Cardinals was inspired by the Holy Spirit to elect American Cardinal Robert Prevost as the new successor to St. Peter. As we all look forward to the many years ahead with our new universal shepherd, let us continue to pray that God who has begun such good work in him may bring it to completion.

There has been some speculation among many people, particularly those in the secular media, on whether the new pope will be more “liberal” or “conservative” than his predecessor. Such speculation is not only foreign to the Catholic mind, but also truly irrelevant. “Liberal” and “conservative” are political terms that have no forbearance upon the governance of Christ’s Church. The only aspect worthy of judgment is orthodoxy. Whether the pope, or indeed any Christian, is orthodox refers to their ability to hold fast to the objective Truth as revealed in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition. No pope, bishop, priest or layman may change what is true. Our only response is faithful acceptance of what has been revealed by Almighty God, especially as it refers to faith and morals. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, how can anyone who is not in possession of the fullness of the faith ascend the throne of St. Peter? At this time of transition we must be comforted by the words of Jesus often quoted by Pope St. John Paul II: “Be not afraid!”

Mothers’ Day Blessing: All mothers present at the Masses this weekend will receive a special Mothers’ Day blessing.

“May Crowning” of a statue of the Blessed Mother will be celebrated on Sunday, May 11, at 10:30 am by our First Communion children. The Blessed Virgin Mary is given special honor by the Church during the month of May. This whole month has been given to Mary. In churches throughout the world public honor is given to her during this month. The *Regina Coeli* (“Queen of Heaven”) hymn is sung as a post communion meditation hymn at Sunday Masses during Easter. The faithful are encouraged to pray the Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary before Mass. Also, free rosaries and other objects of devotion are offered in the narthex throughout May.

Transition Team members met for the first time on April 28. They shared their hopes for the upcoming linkage and reviewed the 5 Year Financial Trend and Parish Life Report for both parish communities. They also looked at Mass attendance trends based on the yearly October mass counts.

Over the next week, Transition Team members will discern a new weekend Mass schedule taking into account the following:

- Each parish will eliminate one weekend Mass. Two Masses will be celebrated at Queen of the Apostles and two Masses at Sacred Heart of Jesus on a weekend.
- The Mass schedule must be able to be covered by one priest.
- Sunday morning Mass times should allow enough time for Religious Education in both parishes.

“Green Burials” have been approved by Bishop Bamera for cemeteries in our diocese. Green Burial is defined as “A way of caring for the dead with minimal environmental impact that aids in the conservation of natural resources, reduction of carbon emissions, protection of worker health, and the restoration and/or preservation of habitat.” Call the parish office if you have any questions regarding green burial. Funeral directors Gregory Zawacki and Mark Kiesinger can also assist you. A portion of the Calvary section of our parish cemetery has been designated for green burials.

Columbarium niches and Mausoleums plots are available: A columbarium for the interment of cremains is located in the Holy Sepulchre section of our cemetery. It is a 120 niche octagonal marble structure that will be accessible by way of a sidewalk from Pine St. The pricing for the niches of our columbarium - Level 1 (bottom): \$1,100 for single space, \$2,200 for double Level 2: \$1,200 single, \$2,400 double Level 3: \$1,300 single, \$2,600 double Level 4: \$1,300 single, \$2,600 double Level 5 (top): \$1,300 single, \$2,600 double In the Gethsemani section of our cemetery, at the corner of Wyoming Ave. and Oak St., ground has been aside solely for the placement of mausoleums. Both double (for two people to be entombed side by side) and single (for one person) mausoleums are available. Cost of plot for private family mausoleum - Single width: \$4,000, Stacking privilege: \$2,000 per tier (3 tier max), Double width: \$6,000, Stacking privilege: \$3,000 per tier (3 tier max). If you would like to purchase a columbarium niche or a mausoleum plot, contact our Parish Office to make an appointment.

The “Cemetery Care” envelope appears each May in our packs. This month was chosen to correspond with Memorial Day. All money collected in this envelope will be deposited in our cemetery account and will be used solely for the upkeep of our venerable parish cemetery in Dupont. Please be generous in your financial support of the burial place of our spiritual forefathers, especially if you have relatives or ancestors buried there. Please take time in May to put your envelope in the collection basket.

NOTICE: Dumping refuse or fill of any sort at our parish cemetery is strictly prohibited. Visitors are ONLY permitted from dawn to dusk at the cemetery. No pets are allowed at any time in the cemetery – dog walking is forbidden. Bicycles, skateboards and ATVs are not permitted at any time. If anyone should see someone violating these regulations, they are asked to report the incident to the parish office immediately. Such violations are acts of disrespect for the holy ground and those buried there.

Cemetery Clean-up Time: It’s that time of year to clean up the cemeteries and prepare for spring and grass-cutting season. We ask that all planters and decorations remaining on lots from last year be removed by May 15. After this date, items will be removed and discarded. Please note, we are not responsible for any items left at the grave sites after May 15. Thank you for your cooperation.
