The Annual Novena in honor of St. Ann has begun and will continue through Thurs., July 25, in anticipation of the feast of Sts. Ann and Joachim, parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary, on July 26. The relic will be offered, and the Novena prayers recited after Masses in both of our churches. Please join in this Novena.

Determine the location and Mass times for the Catholic church nearest your vacation area *before* leaving home. Also, please do not forget to contribute to your home parish when you return from vacation by offering your missed weekly donations in addition to your regular Sunday contributions. *Remember: your parish's expenses never take a vacation!*

Every parish in the Scranton Diocese financially supports our diocesan school system by paying monthly "taxes" to subsidize the entire system, not a particular parochial school. This fiscal year Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish will pay <u>\$51,595.00</u> in school subsidies, and Queen of the Apostles Parish will pay <u>\$54,403.00</u>. This year, the Diocese of Scranton began a new program with the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) Program that will provide every parish the ability to get significant relief on its Catholic school assessments. <u>All EITC donations made by parishioners (individuals or businesses) will go directly to EITC scholarships within the Diocesan Catholic School System. In return, the parish will receive relief on its Catholic School Assessments in the amount of 40% of the total tax credits that new parishioners/businesses donate to the <u>EITC program.</u> More information about this program will be forthcoming. Your participation is encouraged!</u>

Vacation Bible School, hosted by the parishes of Avoca, Dupont, Duryea, and Old Forge, will be held at Holy Rosary School, Duryea, July 28-August 1, from 9:30am to 12pm. Children aged 4 to 11 years are invited to participate in this year's event. During the COVID-19 pandemic there was a dispensation in the Diocese of Scranton from the obligation to participate at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. <u>That dispensation ended on Sunday, August 15, 2021</u>. All Catholics are morally obligated to physically attend Mass – watching a video Mass does not "count" to fulfill one's obligation.

The faithful who attend Mass without music, such as weekday Mass in our parishes, are asked to recite the Entrance and Communion antiphons as part of their participation in the liturgy. These antiphons (or songs) are found in the missalette. The Entrance antiphon is recited by the people as soon as they stand after the bell is rung and the priest and server process into the sanctuary. The Communion antiphon is recited by the people as soon as the priest consumes the Host. When a saint's optional memorial is celebrated on a particular day, please note the feastday choice in the bulletin and use those antiphons.

The faithful stand after the invitation to prayer - Paragraph 146 of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal states: "Upon returning to the middle of the altar, the priest, facing the people and extending and then joining his hands, invites the people to pray, saying, Orate, fratres (Pray, brethren). The people rise and make their response: Suscipiat Dominus (May the Lord accept). Then the priest, with hands extended, says the prayer over the offerings. At the end the people make the acclamation, Amen." Please note that the people stand AFTER the priest's invitation to prayer. Only upon rising do they properly make their response. There seems to be some confusion about this at our Masses. Please make this simple change so as to maintain "holy order" at Mass. Thank you!
