A special second collection will be taken at the Masses this weekend in Avoca to collect money to pay the Pittston Area School District property taxes levied against Queen of the Apostles Parish. Please be as generous as your means allow. It is also understood that Queen of the Apostles Parish will also be receiving Luzerne County and Avoca Municipal taxes from the Avoca tax collector, at which time another special collection will be taken.

Members of both SM Finance and Pastoral Councils who wish to continue to serve must notify Fr. Petro by <u>August 10</u>. Please email or call the SM parish office.

With gratitude to God for their response to His call to serve Him at His altar, the following Queen of Apostles Parishioners have contacted the parish office to declare their intention to continue service as liturgical volunteers at Mass as acolytes, lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Some of these Eucharistic Ministers will continue to bring the Eucharist to the homebound on the First Fridays of the month. Also, we are grateful to the SM choir members who have responded to the call to continue singing in loving praise and adoration of the Lord. They are: Jack Coffay.

Diocesan assessments must be paid to the diocese by every parish each month. June's assessments had not been paid, and July's are also overdue for Queen of the Apostles Parish. The total assessment invoice for these two months is \$23,363.50. Since Queen of the Apostles Parish does not hold sufficient funds in its general operating account to pay these assessments, a transfer from the Queen of Apostles Diocesan Savings account to pay this assessment has taken place. The total amount in this savings account was \$28,174.10. After the withdrawal from savings, the total remaining is \$4,810.60. As of today, \$8,645.69 is the total amount in the general operating account (parish checking). The bill for the August diocesan assessment has arrived, payable by August 31. The August assessment is \$10,799.50. *Currently, Queen of Apostles Parish is in debt to the diocese in the amount of \$720,310.00*.

The "Social Concerns/Respect Life Committee" is a group in Queen of the Apostles Parish created to care for the poor and promote the pro-life message. At the start of June, the group had \$7,514.56 in its charitable account. By the end of the month, only \$279.83 remained. On June 11, a check for \$200 was sent to the St. Vincent de Paul Soup Kitchen in Wilkes-Barre. On June 18, five checks were written: \$1,000 to Holy Rosary School, Duryea; \$1,000 to the Wilkes-Barre Pennsylvanians for Human Life, \$1,000 to the Scranton Pennsylvanians for Human Life; \$2,000 to Providence Pregnancy Center, Scranton; \$300 to West Side Social Club, Avoca. On June 26, the group had a party for themselves at Colarusso's 2.0 and spent \$914.74 on food and \$70.04 on cake. On June 27 another check was written to the Wilkes-Barre Pennsylvanians for Human Life in the amount of \$800. Given these extraordinary financial expenditures, after much consideration, Fr. Petro has temporarily frozen their account and suspended their activities. Pending a report from a recently completed diocesan audit, Fr. Petro will address this concern, and others pertaining to Avoca, with the diocese.

Requiescant in pace: pray for the peaceful repose of the souls of Dorothy Novak (SH) and Robert Strelish (SH) who were recently buried from our church.

"Count Teams" are in the process of being created for Queen of the Apostles Parish. These two teams will consist of parishioner volunteers who will count the weekly offertory contributions. Such teams following diocesan guidelines had not existed prior in Avoca.

Marian Scholarships have traditionally been granted to graduating high school seniors from Queen of the Apostles Parish. A \$50 gift would be given to each graduate, and they and their families would be treated to a meal. However, this year each graduate received a Marian Scholarship of \$300 in June, thereby bringing the balance in the scholarship fund checking account to \$0. This account was subsequently closed at the bank immediately prior to Fr. Petro's arrival, thus ending the parish scholarship tradition.

The air conditioning repairs to the units in the ceiling of St. Mary's Church are ongoing. Water continues to collect in the trays, not making it possible to turn the units on again until the technical problem is solved. Insurance will not cover the expense of the mechanical repairs, but it will cover the expenses incurred on our ceiling murals (\$1,000 deductible). Ritterbeck of Moosic had been contacted to repair the paintings. However, the 2025-2026 insurance premium is due for Queen of the Apostles Parish in the amount of \$23,226.00. It has not been paid.

Annual Blue Mass: borough council members, law enforcement officers, firefighters, paramedics, and other first responders from Avoca, Dupont, Hughestown, Moosic and other municipalities are invited to a "Blue Mass" celebrated on Patriot Day, September 11, at 7 p.m. in St. Mary's Church, Avoca. This is a special liturgy, held annually, that honors and prays for the safety and well-being of all public safety personnel. A "Blue Mass" is a Catholic Eucharistic liturgy celebrated to honor and pray for law enforcement officers, firefighters, paramedics, and other first responders. It is a way to express gratitude for their service and to seek God's blessing for their safety and protection. The name "Blue Mass" comes from the traditional color of many first responder uniforms. The tradition of the Blue Mass began in 1934, but in recent decades its celebration has been tied to the remembrance of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks on our country, as well as the memory of those first responders who have died this past year. This Mass will include prayers for the fallen, those currently serving, and their families. It will also feature a procession of first responders in their dress uniforms from the Avoca Fire Department building to St. Mary's Church, a homily focused on the importance of their service, and a blessing of their equipment. All present are invited to a light social in our Queen of the Apostles Parish Hall following the Mass.

A Giant Indoor Flea Market will be held Saturday, Sept. 13 and Sunday, Sept. 14 in the SH church hall. Donated items will be accepted from Aug. 1 – Sept. 6. (no clothing and no electronics.) Please deposit them in the Walnut Street vestibule. Parishioners from both of our parishes are invited to participate! The book for 2026 Mass intentions for our parishes will open on Monday, August 18, 2025, at 8:30 a.m. You may visit the parish office, use the Mass intention envelopes found in the narthex, or use the postal system to make your 2026 requests. The offering of Mass for deceased loved ones is a real spiritual gift to assist souls in purgatory and allow our beloved dead to know of our loving remembrance. Many people have Masses said in their parishes on death anniversaries or other significant dates. Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living. The stipend for a Mass intention is \$10. Our parish secretaries record the requests.

ASSUMPTION HARVEST BLESSING: Throughout the ages the Church in her ritual commemorated the feast of the Assumption by the blessing of herbs, flowers and other produce brought to church by the faithful. To perpetuate this pious custom, Fr. Petro will bless the herbs, flowers, fruits and vegetables from your gardens during the 4 p.m. Mass on Aug. 14 and the 5:30 p.m. Mass on Aug. 15. Please bring these items to the sanctuary of the church before Mass and place them on the table by the Blessed Mother altar.
