SH Polish Picnic Report: The gross profit for this year's Polish Picnic (i.e., before the bills are paid) amounted to \$50,775.36. Our picnic expenses totaled \$16,064.09. The net profit (after all the bills have been paid) amounted to \$34,711.27. *Thank you, volunteers!*

Fr. Jones Gyabaa-Yeboa, a priest from the Sunyani Diocese, will visit our parishes the weekend of August 23/24. He will hear confessions and celebrate all Masses that weekend. Fr. Jones will speak about the works of the Diocese of Sunyani in Ghana, West Africa, which was established in 1973. With the permission of Bishop Bambera, Fr. Jones will make a missionary appeal in our parish (SH) to assist them in their work of evangelization. <u>A second collection will be taken only at Sacred Heart for them that weekend.</u>

Thank you to all who contributed to the special second collection taken at the Masses last weekend in Avoca to collect money to pay the Pittston Area School District property taxes levied against Queen of the Apostles Parish. A total of \$515 was realized.

Annual Blue Mass: borough council members, law enforcement officers, firefighters, paramedics, and other first responders from Avoca, Dupont, Hughestown, Moosic and other municipalities are invited to a "Blue Mass" celebrated on Patriot Day, September 11, at 7 p.m. in St. Mary's Church, Avoca. This is a special liturgy, held annually, that honors and prays for the safety and well-being of all public safety personnel. A "Blue Mass" is a Catholic Eucharistic liturgy celebrated to honor and pray for law enforcement officers, firefighters, paramedics, and other first responders. It is a way to express gratitude for their service and to seek God's blessing for their safety and protection. The name "Blue Mass" comes from the traditional color of many first responder uniforms. The tradition of the Blue Mass began in 1934, but in recent decades its celebration has been tied to the remembrance of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks on our country, as well as the memory of those first responders who have died this past year. This Mass will include prayers for the fallen, those currently serving, and their families. It will also feature a procession of first responders in their dress uniforms from the Avoca Fire Department building to St. Mary's Church, a homily focused on the importance of their service, and a blessing of their equipment. All present are invited to a light social in our Queen of the Apostles Parish Hall following the Mass.

Parishioners from both our parishes may purchase niches for cremated remains.
